- Dealing with reports of code of conduct violations
  - Add language to protect the people who are being reported on as well those who are reporting
- Edited by someone with experience in putting these kinds of document together
  - Where to find someone with legal experience/code of conduct? Is this useful to us?
    - Kari Jordan at Carpentries
    - Christine Kirkpatrick at San Diego Supercomputing
    - ASU lawyers (organizations have to be rooted in a place, could that be ASU because of Sloan funding/funding in general)
- Document could be used for legal proceedings- so, someone with knowledge of Code of Conducts/legal aspects should look over the document
  - Made clear that this is not a legal document
  - Report under Title IX, etc should be phrased differently
- Too long? People won't read unless something happened
  - Can we make a shortened version to go along with the longer version?
- Should be discussed at Members Council Meeting
  - Legal team at ASU should probably look at this
- Invite De and Rebecca next month to talk about this more before the Members Council Meeting

- Working group and early career scholars reports
  - Standards Working Group: survey to possible members of working group sent out
    - First meeting to decide where to start and get the working group started
  - Certification Working Group: survey ready to go; places to start
    - Practical aspect of searching for software and models- how users search vs how it is described
      - Following the <u>NISO reproducibility badging guidelines</u> for a badge service API would fairly trivially support some kind of index / discovery service to find all "badged" / certified OMF models
        - Use document as blueprint, we don't need to be certified by them → don't reinvent, use what is out there and modify as needed
    - How to ensure or inform about quality of models/incentivizing
    - Chris to write up priorities of Certification Working Group
      - 2 day meeting to talk about priorities for working group: money for chairs to travel to these kinds of meetings
  - o Cyberinfrastructure
    - Web update and SGCI consultation- submitted form to start process
    - Would benefit from additional co-chair(s)
- Planning Members Council meeting in March setting up initial agenda
  - 18 responses to attendance survey: 73% will attend remotely
  - Email to be sent out soon: Mandatory Meeting for ALL Members, please respond
- Sloan grant discussion
  - Process for allocating travel money
    - Who gets assistance to attend the meeting, how do we decide?
    - Letter/form: specify what kinds of information
      - Region, stakeholder group, diversity criteria, description, why they need support
  - Setting up student support for working groups (stipend only, not tuition money)
    - Volker will be speaking to Serena about it who may have someone
    - Too late to hire at ASU for the semester
      - undergraduates?
    - Where to look for students- we are not location dependent with Sloan money (can be in the US or international)
      - But a student residing nearby to working group chairs would be best to facilitate relationships and discussion
      - Advertisement for students or not- description of what they would do does not need to be substantial (\$20-21,000 for year, either calendar year or 2 semesters)
- Activating OMF Affiliates
  - Monica Grenadas, Open Climate Campaign/Creative Commons: make FAIR data and models open. Not ready for organization to join OMF
  - Activate Affiliates list- start adding and sending certain things to this list

- Form for signing up affiliates
- Is there a newsletter in the future??? Just a few times/year probably
  - Who would want to edit this and put it together (outreach group?)

NSF Geo OSE- CUAHSI possibly partner with OMF to apply for funding through this program
